### "Border Around and Along" A Guild Quilt Along

If you like a little mystery and you are interested in a personal round robin, this is a new quilting activity for you! Begin your quilt in January by making a 12 1/2" (unfinished) block of your choice. Add successive borders in February, April, June, August, and October, bringing the quilt size to approximately 41" square.



I've designed four options for each of the borders. Some are easy; some are more complicated. It's your choice; it's your quilt! You may always substitute a design of your own as long as it meets the size requirements for that month. The one thing I can't provide is yardage requirements since these will be determined by your decisions. Directions will accompany your TQG newsletter every other month, allowing you plenty of time to plan and execute the next border.

What fabrics will you choose for your Border Around and Along quilt? Spring-time colors? Patriotic prints for a VA quilt? Fall leaf hues? Christmas reds and greens? It will be fun to compare the progress of the participants at guild meetings and on the TQG Facebook page.

## TQG - 2021 Block of the Month - January: Choosing your Options by Abigail Dolinger

Announcing the Tarheel Quilt Guild Block of the Month program for 2021! Since we will begin the year meeting virtually, rather than making blocks for a drawing, make 8" patchwork blocks for your own quilt, a few each month. **The Block of the Month quilt-along (QAL) begins in January, the month for planning and selecting fabric.** February through November, instructions for blocks will be included in TQG newsletters and will be posted on the first of the month on Aby's blog ([abyquilts.wordpress.com](http://abyquilts.wordpress.com)). In December, you will finish your quilt top by combining the blocks you made throughout the year with sashing or alternate blocks.

For this Block of the Month QAL, you have several options. The **first option** is the size of the quilt. You may choose to make a lap quilt, a throw-size quilt, or a bed quilt. The larger the project, the greater number of blocks you need to make per month.

Lap Quilt	52" x 68"	18 blocks	about 2 per month
Throw Quilt	68" x 84"	32 blocks	about 3 per month
Bed Quilt	84" x 84"	41 blocks	about 4 per month

The **second option** is fabric palette. You may choose to use a line of fabric, to use coordinating fabric from stash, or to go totally scrappy. The Lap Quilt and Throw Quilt are layer cake (10" squares) and fat quarter friendly. If choosing fat quarters, you need eight to ten, two or three each of several colors. The Bed Quilt requires at least twelve fat quarters of colorful fabrics.

The **third option** is the block(s) you will make. Each month, February – November, instructions for a primary design will be given as well as suggestions for several variations. You have the option to make all your blocks of the same design, to recolor the blocks, or to make a variation of the primary design.

The **fourth option** is the layout of your quilt. One of the sample quilts uses the "Hourglass" design for alternate blocks; however, another setting may appeal to you more. You may work on alternate setting blocks throughout the year.

Fabric requirements for the sample quilt with "Hourglass" alternate blocks:

### Lap Quilt, 52" x 68"

- 1 layer cake of 42 10" squares **or** 8-10 fat quarters of various colors
- 1 ½ yd. background fabric, for patchwork and 1<sup>st</sup> border
- 1 yd. light solid fabric ("Hourglass" blocks)
- 1 yd. medium solid fabric ("Hourglass" blocks)
- 1 yd. coordinating solid or print fabric for 2<sup>nd</sup> border

### Throw Quilt, 68" x 84"

- 1 layer cake of 42 10" squares **or** 8-10 fat quarters of various colors
- 1 ¾ yd. background fabric, for patchwork
- 1 ¼ yd. light solid fabric ("Hourglass" blocks)
- 1 ¼ yd. medium solid fabric ("Hourglass" blocks)
- 1 ½ yds. accent fabric for 1<sup>st</sup> border and binding
- 1 ¼ yd. coordinating solid or print fabric for 2<sup>nd</sup> border

### Bed Quilt, 84" x 84"

- 12-14 fat quarters of various colors
- 2 ½ yds. background fabric, for patchwork
- 1 ½ yds. light solid fabric ("Hourglass" blocks)
- 1 ½ yds. medium solid fabric ("Hourglass" blocks)
- 1 ¾ yds. accent fabric for 1<sup>st</sup> border and binding
- 1 ½ yds. coordinating solid or print fabric for 2<sup>nd</sup> border
