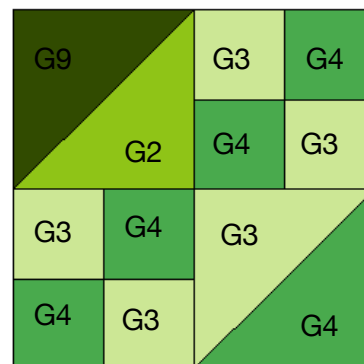
Block

3

In your “Block 3” bag, you should have:

2” G3 squares - 32 ea.

2” G4 squares - 32 ea.



Using all those 2” squares, construct a total of SIXTEEN four patches. Place them in the “Block 3” bag.

Take one 3^{1/2}” strip out of your “G2” and your “G9” bags. Place a “G2” and a “G9” strip right sides together, and cut the selvages off. Using your Easy Angle Ruler cut 8 pairs of triangles (the darkened tip of the ruler will extend beyond the edge of the fabric). You will have approximately one half of each strip left; place them back into their respective bags. Sew the triangle pairs together on the hypotenuse (that is the long side) to form half-square triangles. Press the seams towards the dark (G9).

You should now have EIGHT half-square triangles, each measuring 3^{1/2}” - place them in the “Block 3” bag.

In your “G3” and your “G4” bags you should have strips that are 3^{1/2}” by approximately 21”. Place those “G3” and “G4” strips right sides together, and cut the selvages off. Using your Easy Angle Ruler cut 8 pairs of triangles (the darkened tip of the ruler will extend beyond the edge of the fabric). Sew the triangle pairs together on the hypotenuse (that is the long side) to form half-square triangles. Press the seams towards the dark (G4).

You should now have EIGHT half-square triangles, each measuring 3^{1/2}” - place them in the “Block 3” bag.

You now have all the parts you need to construct your “Block 3”. When putting this block together, make sure that your four patches and your half-square triangles are oriented correctly (follow the diagram above).

You will have EIGHT blocks; place them into the “Block 3” bag.

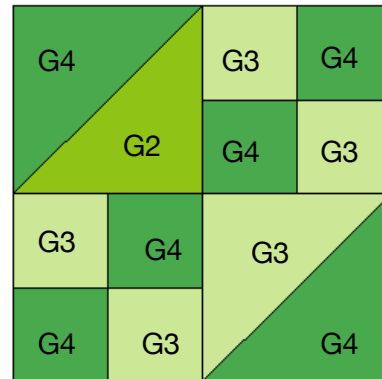

In your “Block 4” bag, you should have:

2” G3 squares - 8 ea.

2” G4 squares - 8 ea.

3^{1/2}” Half Square Triangles (G2/G4) - 2 ea.



Using all of the 2” squares, construct a total of FOUR four patches. Place them in the “Block 4” bag.

Take one 3^{1/2}” strip out of your “G3” bag. Place the “G3” strip and the “G4” strip (the piece you saved from the previous step) right sides together, and cut the selvages off. Using your Easy Angle Ruler cut 2 pairs of triangles (the darkened tip of the ruler will extend beyond the edge of the fabric). Place the remainder of your strips back into their respective bags. Sew the triangle pairs together on the hypotenuse (that is the long side) to form half-square triangles. Press the seams towards the dark (G4).

You should now have TWO half-square triangles, each measuring 3^{1/2}” - place them in the “Block 4” bag.

You now have all the parts you need to construct your “Block 4”. When putting this block together, make sure that your four patches and your half-square triangles are oriented correctly (follow the diagram above).

You will have TWO blocks; place them into the “Block 4” bag.

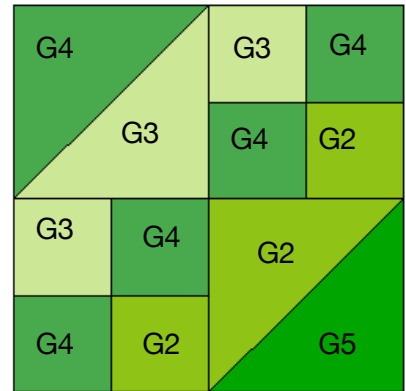
In your “Block 5” bag, you should have:

2” G2 squares - 24 ea.

2” G3 squares - 24 ea.

2” G4 squares - 48 ea.

Using all those 2” squares, construct a total of TWENTY FOUR four patches, carefully following the diagram above. Place them in the “Block 5” bag.



Take one $3\frac{1}{2}$ ” strip out of your “G5” and one out of your “G2” bags. Place a “G2” and a “G5” strip right sides together, and cut the selvages off. Using your Easy Angle Ruler cut 12 pairs of triangles (the darkened tip of the ruler will extend beyond the edge of the fabric). Place the remainder of your strips back into their respective bags. Sew the triangle pairs together on the hypotenuse (that is the long side) to form half-square triangles. Press the seams towards the dark (G5).

You should now have TWELVE half-square triangles, each measuring $3\frac{1}{2}$ ” - place them in the “Block 5” bag.

In your “G3” and your “G4” bags you should have one strip of each that measure $3\frac{1}{2}$ ” x approx. 35”. Place those strips right sides together, and cut the selvages off. Using your Easy Angle Ruler cut 12 pairs of triangles (the darkened tip of the ruler will extend beyond the edge of the fabric). Sew the triangle pairs together on the hypotenuse (that is the long side) to form half-square triangles. Press the seams towards the dark (G4).

You should now have TWELVE half-square triangles, each measuring $3\frac{1}{2}$ ” - place them in the “Block 5” bag.

You now have all the parts you need to construct your “Block 5”. When putting these TWELVE blocks together, make sure that your four patches and your half-square triangles are oriented correctly (follow the diagram above).
