Baby Quilts - Received 16 in March. 71 Total on hand. None were delivered to CFVH due to no response from hospital contact. No batting on hand, but have 4 labels in stock. Both have been ordered. Chairperson advised she generally delivers 32 quilts per month.

VA Quilts - 62 left after VA delivery February 2021.

7 received since, bringing total on hand to 69.

Sunshine report - 4 birthday cards were sent. Thinking of you card to member Mary Larson, who is Donna Saunder's mother. Mary is in the hospital in Kansas and will be having surgery. Bonnie McPhail has lost her mother. Five of our members have had surgery since we were together the last time and we have one more with surgery pending. Please let Mary Lou know about our members and/or family members so she can respond to each need.

The President gave details of the agreement with The Masonic Lodge to use their building for our guild meetings. They are not charging us for the use, except to make a contribution toward utilities during the year and make them one quilt each year so they can sell tickets or auction off. We do have the limit of 44 persons capacity; and they ask us to please leave the room as we find it. There will be no foods set up for these meetings due to the space limitations. VA Quilts



Phoenix Masonic Lodge, our new place to meet every month, is beautiful with lots of history. It is a good place for quilting. Five VA quilts were turned in making a total of 67 on hand.

Today I'm sharing a few things

about quilts in the Colonies. Daily life was difficult for colonial settlers. Many women could not sit in front of the fire and quilt. They were far too busy with life of 1700's. Artificial lighting was poor with short days and long winter nights. Most women made quilts between May and November. These whole cloth quilts were made of 3 layers. The top, the filling, and the back

were quilted together (by hand) with elaborate designs. These designs resulted in patterns of texture and shadows. See the trapunto image.

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
Block #8: You will make 5 blocks

Cut 10 3" squares from the G2 bag; Cut 10 3" squares from the G6 bag

Now in your #8 bag you should have: 15 G6 2 ½" squares; 5 G2 2 ½" squares; 5 G2 3 ½" squares; 10 G2 3" squares; 10 G6 3" squares; 5 G6 rectangles (for stem)

Make 4 (per block) G2/G6 HST blocks by whatever method you prefer.

Put together following the diagram below:



Place finished blocks in Bag #8


Block #19:

Take one 2" strip out of Bag G1 and cut 8 2" squares. Put rest of strip back in the bag. In Bag 19 you should now have: 8 G1 2" squares; 8 G2 2" squares; 8 G8 2" squares

Draw a line from corner to corner on the back of the 8 G1 2" squares

Make the following HSTs: (4) G1/G2; (4) G2/G3 putting those pairs together and sewing on the drawn diagonal line

Put block together following the diagram below:



"Options" - #4 – Album Written by Abigail Dolinger, Dec. 2020

Make two (three, four) 8 ½" blocks that will finish at 8" in the "Options" quilt. For your first block, try the Primary Design. Then choose one of the Options for another block. You could simply vary the colors/fabrics used, or substitute a 4" (finished) patchwork block for the center square, or add HSTs (half square triangles) in the corners.

Primary Design

Cutting

Background – Eight 2 ½" squares

Colors – Four 2 ½" x 4 ½" rectangles (navy for triangles)

One 4 ½" square (floral for center)

Four 2 ½" squares (green for corners)


Background – Eight 2 ½" squares

Colors – Four 2 ½" x 4 ½" rectangles (navy for triangles)

One 4 ½" square (red print for center diamond)

Four 2 ½" squares (light blue for center triangles)

Four 2 ½" squares (yellow for corners)



Option B

Cutting


Background – Eight 2 ½" squares

Two 3" squares (for corner HSTs)

Colors – Four 2 ½" x 4 ½" rectangles (red for triangles)

One 4 ½" square (black print for center)

Two 3" squares (gray for corner HSTs)





Option C


Substitute any 4" finished patchwork or applique unit for the center square.

Examples: Four Patch, Pinwheel, Heart, Flower

Plan your blocks – use colored pencils to fill in the spaces







Sewing the Primary Design

Step 1 – Make Flying Geese units.

Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of all eight 2 ½" background squares. The numbered sentences for making the first step of Flying Geese units correspond to the four units in the picture below.



(1) Place a background 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square on the right-hand end of the 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle. Note the orientation of the drawn line. Sew on the line. (2) Flip the triangle outward to check for sewing accuracy. (3) Flip the triangle inward in order to trim away excess seam allowance. (4) Then flip the triangle outward again.

The numbered sentences for making the second step of Flying Geese units correspond to the four units in the next picture.



(1) Place a background 2 ½" square on the left-hand end of the 2 ½" x 4 ½" rectangle. Note the orientation of the drawn line. Sew on the line. (2) Flip the triangle outward to check for sewing accuracy. (3) Flip the triangle inward in order to trim away excess seam allowance. (4) Then flip the triangle outward again. **The four Flying Geese units should measure 2** ½" x 4 ½."

Step 2 – Assemble the block.

On your work table, lay out the components of the Album block. Sew together in three rows of three units each. Press the seams away from the Flying Geese units. Sew the three rows together; press the seams away from the center row as the arrows indicate. The block measures 8 ½" square unfinished (and 8" square when sewn into the quilt.)



Sewing Option A

Step 1 – Make four Flying Geese units.

Follow Step 1 in the Sewing the Primary Design instructions to make four Flying Geese units using four 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles (navy) and eight 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares (background).




Step 2 – Make center Square in a Square.

Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of four 2 ½" squares (light blue). Place two of the squares in opposite corners of the 4 ½" square (red print), right sides together. Sew on the drawn lines. Flip the resulting triangles outward to check sewing accuracy; press. Flip triangles inward and trim away excess seam allowance; flip triangles outward again.






Place the other two squares (light blue) in the remaining opposite corners of the 4 ½" square (red print), right sides together. Sew on the drawn lines. Flip the resulting triangles outward to check sewing accuracy; press. Flip triangles inward and trim away excess seam allowance; flip triangles outward again. This Square in a Square unit measures 4 ½" square.



Step 3 – Assemble the block

On your work table, lay out the components of the Album block. Sew together in three rows of three units each. Press the seams away from the Flying Geese units. Sew the three rows together; press the seams away from the center row as the arrows indicate.

The block measures 8 ½" square unfinished (and will measure 8" square when sewn into the quilt.)



Sewing Option B

Step 1 – Make four Flying Geese units.

Follow Step 1 in the Sewing the Primary Design instructions to make Four Flying Geese units using four 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles (red) and Eight 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares (background).



Step 2 – Make four HSTs.

Work with the two 3" background squares and the two 3" colorful (gray) squares.

Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of the two background squares.


Place the background squares right sides together with the colorful (gray) squares.

Sew ¼" away from both sides of the drawn line.

Cut apart on the drawn line.

Press seams toward the darker triangle.

Trim to measure 2 ½" square.



Step 3 – Assemble the block.

On your work table, lay out the components of the Album block. Sew together in three rows of three units each.

Press the seams away from the Flying Geese units.

Sew the three rows together; press the seams away from the center row as the arrows indicate.

The block measures 8 ½" square unfinished (and will measure 8" square when sewn into the quilt.)
