Aza's Kugel Recipe - Submitted by Aza-Tifarah Firlit:

Ingredients:

8 oz cream cheese
1 pint sour cream
1 pint cottage cheese
4 eggs
1 can crushed pineapple
1 can fruit cocktail
1 can mandarin oranges
1 cup sugar
1 package noodles (I use yolk less)
Corn flakes with sugar and cinnamon

Directions:

Heat oven to 350 degrees.
Cook noodles.
Mix all ingredients together, then add noodles.
Place in a greased 9"x13" pan.
Put crushed corn flakes with sugar and cinnamon on top.
Bake for 65 minutes.

FOR SALE:

1) Husqvarna/Viking Designer I Sewing/Embroidery Machine, with manuals, hard case, soft case, what I think is a project case (or it's a case to hold feet, thread and accessories), a wheeled cart, and small, large and mega-large embroidery hoops. Software includes 3D Upgrade, 3D CrossStitch, Raggedy Ann and Andy, Digitizer, Demo CD, VIP Professional CD, Quick Font Plus, and Woodland Song. Also includes: Stabilizer sampler pack, Designer I Embroidery Sampler kit with 6 spools of Sulky thread and embroidery scissors. There is also some type of kit, with gold and silver fabric, batting, stabilizer, with a pack of machine embroidery needles and 1 spool each of white and silver Sulky thread, and a small spool of gray thread (there's no pattern, but it looks Christmassy). There are also 12 bobbins and 11 presser feet. The only thing I know that's missing is one of the little rubber stabilizers on the bottom. The Internet based instructions are printed and in notebooks.

2) PFAFF Baby Lock 756 Serger with manuals

3) 30 cones of cotton Talon serger thread 11 still in wrappers, with a hard case that holds 18 of them, 6-pack of Robison Anton Christmas thread kit (looks like rayon), plus 2 additional large spools of rayon thread

Cutting Mat Care - Submitted by Karen Potts

It is recommended that you soak your self-healing rotary cutting mat from time to time...your self-healing mat loves moisture!

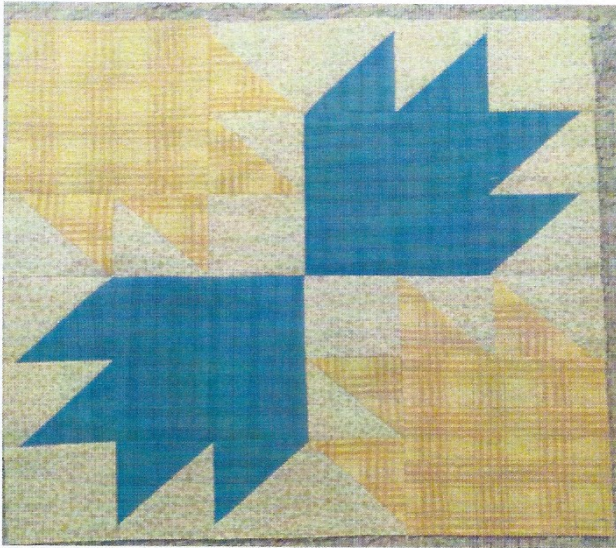
To soak it, place your mat in a bathtub or large container (big enough that your mat will lay flat) and soak it for 15-20 minutes in a solution of 1/4 cup white vinegar to every gallon of cool water...let me repeat, **cool water**. Do this every so often to help extend it's useful life.

Then use a squirt of mild dishwashing soap (like Ivory) and clean the mat with a mushroom brush (**soft** is the key word here). The purpose of this gentle scouring is to remove the fibers that get trapped in the cut marks, preventing the cuts from "healing".

Keep 'em clean, keep 'em moist, keep 'em flat and NO heat. Your cutting mat is not a coffee cup coaster!

Bear Tracks -- October 2016



Background - medium beige tone on tone:

- 8 - 3" squares
- 4 - 2 1/2" squares

Two different plaid fabrics - medium to dark

- 4 - 3" squares of plaid #1
- 2 - 4 1/2" squares of plaid #1
- 4 - 3" squares of plaid #2
- 2 - 4 1/2" squares of plaid #2

Begin With the eight 3" background squares and the eight plaid 3" squares make 16 half square triangle unites - eight of each color

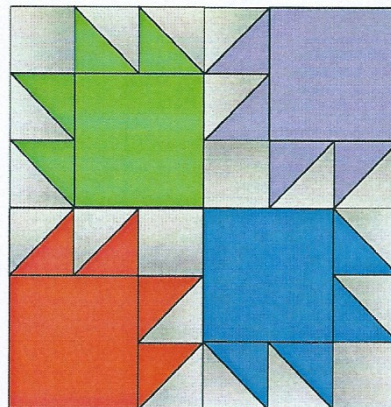
Bear

Paw: To make one bear paw - sew 2 plaid half square triangles of the same color & one 2 1/2" background square together in a row. Then sew 2 plaid (same color) half square triangles together.

Next: Sew 4 1/2" square with the 2 plaid half square triangles - then sew the 2 half squares & plain background to the top of the block

Turn blocks like this:

And sew together!
