The rules for the challenge were discussed at the January meeting, published in the February newsletter and are available on the Guild website. If you are participating in the challenge (and I hope you are), remember to cover your name on the label and to also bring a card or post-it note identifying the block you modified to make your quilt.

Lay your quilt on the stage, it will be given a number and guild members will vote on it during the meeting. I will need a volunteer who is not participating in the challenge to help me tally the votes.

Our next challenge, "Black, White and Bright" will be held in July". Effective with that challenge - ONE ENTRY PER MEMBER PER CHALLENGE! Why? Many of our members work full time, are self-employed, involved in child or elder care, are active in other non-profit groups and only have the time to make one quilt. March Program: QuiltCon 2023

Irene Grimes, Sana Moulder, Pat Poulson, and Flora McClain presented information about their trip to QuiltCon 2023 in Atlanta, GA. They talked about their experiences including the themes of inclusion & diversity, being accepted as a quilter and the originality of the designs they saw. QuiltCon included over 6,000 quilts representing all 50 state and over 20 countries with only 23% of quilts submitted being accepted. One of those accepted was made by Sana. QuiltCon is scheduled to be in Raleigh 2024. If you're interested, consider joining the Modern Quilt Guild (the \$35 membership fee includes a 4 day pass to convention). There are opportunities to submit quilts, view entries, shop, volunteer, and take classes.






This makes a 12" finished block!


** Preparing the Pieces and Sewing the Block **




First cut the Color 1 3-1/2" x 7" strip into two 3-1/2" squares. Repeat this step with Colors 2, 3 and 4...



Now cut the Color 1 2" x 4" strip into two 2" squares. Repeat this step with Colors 2, 3 and 4...



Then cut the Color 5 3-1/2" x 28" strip into eight 3-1/2" squares...



Next place a small Color 1 square atop a Color 5 3-1/2" square, right sides together, and edges lined up with one corner of the Color 5 square. On the back of the top small square lightly draw the diagonal, and sew ON this marked line. Cut off the excess seam allowance, and press the remainder towards the darker fabric. Make two units like this for Colors 1, 2, 3 and 4...



Now piece the block in the order shown at left. Alternate pressing directions as you add squares, and also as you add rows when sewing the rows together! All your seams should be 1/4" seams!
