Allison and Pam Gahan for providing an update on our 2025 Quilt Show. Our space has been reserved at the Freedom Christian Academy SportsPlex for June 13 & 14th 2025. A discussion about a theme was held and membership suggested LaFayette, Liberty, Friendship, Freedom as possible themes. The theme Liberty, Legacy and LaFayette was also recommended. Membership will vote on a theme at the April meeting. (Fayetteville NC is the only city named for LaFayette in which he actually stepped foot and 2025 is the 200 year anniversary celebration). Kelcey Grice is working on a guilt theme with French influences as a possible raffle guilt to tie into the theme. Various roles are needed in order to make the show a success including vendor liaison, advertising, making items for the boutique and more. TQG is a member of the LaFayette Society (housed at City Center Gallery and Books) and there was talk of a LaFayette quilt made by founding member Kay Bryant was displayed (update - a photo has been located!). 

-<u>Linda Hahn</u> will teach Beauty on the Beach June 22nd. The cost is \$40 for members. If space permits, non-member guests are \$50.


-Aby Dolinger will teach Ribbon Star and Chain on August 24th (tentative). The cost is \$40 for members.

#### **CHALLENGES 2024**

Chair: Linda DeGraw

This year there will be three challenges (April, July and November).

Prize money will be \$50, \$40 and \$30.

Only one entry per quilter.

#### April - Baby Book Favorite

What is your favorite baby book to read to your little ones? We'll be using the Crayola 64 crayons (I'll provide the box). And everyone interested in participating in the Challenge will pick two (2) colors, and add a neutral color of cream, white or grey. The three (3) chosen colors must be in your quilt and the design will be from your chosen baby book. (Winnie the Pooh, Eeyore, Kanga). In addition to the finished quilt please bring a note card that states the name of the book and the crayons that you used. The quilt must meet the standard requirements for NICU quilts (36' x 36'). Quilter's name on label should be covered with painter's tape or filled in after the challenge prizes are awarded.

#### July - The State Fair!

This quilt is your vision of the State Fair. Your quilt may be as large as 55"x 55" or as small as 18" x 18". Everyone will be given a fat quarter you must use a piece of in your quilt. You may use collage, traditional blocks, paper piecing, applique or other techniques you wish to show us. Quilter's name on label should be covered with painter's tape or filled in after the challenge prizes are awarded.

#### November - Your America

Make a VA quilt. Your quilt must meet standard requirements for a VA quilt (45" x 45") Please do not make a flag. Show us your idea of America: ie. a playground, a snow topped mountain, a church or a beach. Quilter's name on label should be covered with painter's tape or filled in after the challenge prizes are awarded.







#### Tarheel Quilters Guild - Block of the Month

# **Tulip Quilt Block**

For one 6" x 12" (finished) tulip quilt block you will need:

From the background fabric:


- (2) 2" x 3.5" rectangles
- (2) 2.5" x 3" rectangles
- (6) 2.25" x 2.25" squares

From red fabric:

- (4) 2" x 2" squares
- (1) 5" x 6.5 rectangle

From green fabric:

- (1) 1.5" x 6.5"
- (2) 3" x 4.5"




Mark a line corner to corner on the wrong side of each red square. Place one red square on top of one of the background rectangles, right sides together, lining up the red square along the short side of the rectangle. Sew on the diagonal line, then cut away the excess fabric 1/2" away from the sewn. Open and press toward the dark fabric. Place the other red square on the right side of the same rectangle, right sides together, lining up the red square along the short side of the rectangle. Sew on the diagonal line, then cut away the excess fabric 1/2" away from the sewn. Open and press toward the dark fabric.

Make 2


Sew the 2 flying geese together.

Sew the 5" x 6.5" rectangle to the flying geese.



Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the 2.25" background squares (6). Place two on the bottom corners of the red tulip. Sew on the line and cut away the excess fabric 1/2" from the seam. Press.

Sew the (4) 2.25" to the (2) 2.5" x 3" green leaf units as shone. Sew the leaf units to the stem 1.5" x 6.5" green strip. Sew the stem and leaves to the red tulip unit. Tulip block should measure 6.5" x 12.5". Make two blocks.
