Take two 3” strips out of your “G5” and also two 3” strips out of your “Tan” bags. Place each a “Tan” and a “G5” strip right sides together, and cut the selvages off. Using your Easy Angle Ruler cut 28 pairs of triangles (the darkened tip of the ruler will extend beyond the edge of the fabric). You will be able to get 18 pairs out of the first strip set and then cut another 10 out of the second strip set; place the remainder of the strips back into their respective bags. Sew the triangle pairs together on the hypotenuse (that is the long side) to form half-square triangles. Press the seams towards the dark (G5).

You should now have TWENTY-EIGHT half-square triangles, each measuring 2 1/2” - place twelve into the “Block 10” bag, another twelve into the “Block 13” bag and the remaining four into the “Block 9” bag.

Take four 2 1/2” strips out of your “G5” and also four 3” strips out of your “Red” bags. Place each “Red” and each “G5” strips right sides together, and cut the selvages off. Using your Easy Angle Ruler cut 72 pairs of triangles (the darkened tip of the ruler will extend beyond the edge of the fabric); you will use up all four strip sets.

Sew the triangle pairs together on the hypotenuse (that is the long side) to form half-square triangles. Press the seams towards the dark (G5).

You should now have SEVENTY-TWO half-square triangles, each measuring 2 1/2” - place sixteen into the “Block 10” bag, twenty-four into the “Block 11” bag, twelve into the “Block 12” bag, sixteen into the “Block 13” bag and the remaining four into the “Block 9” bag.

Take two 2 1/2” strips out of your “G3” bag and also two 3” strips out of your “G5” bag. Place each “G3” and each “G5” strips together, and cut the selvages off. Using your Easy Angle Ruler cut 30 pairs of triangles (the darkened tip of the ruler will extend beyond the edge of the fabric) from the strip pairs. You may have a short piece of “G3” and “G5” left over from the second strip (depending on the usable width of your fabric) - if you do, place the remaining pieces back into their respective bags.

Sew the triangle pairs together on the hypotenuse (that is the long side) to form half-square triangles. Press the seams towards the dark (G5).

You should now have THIRTY EIGHT half-square triangles, each measuring $2\frac{1}{2}$ " - place four into the "Block 10" bag, twenty-four into the "Block 11" bag, six into the "Block 12" bag, and the remaining four into the "Block 13" bag.

In your "G5" and your "G9" bags, you should have a short strip (left from another step) - these strips should be approx. $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 20".

Place each "G3" and each "G5" strips together, and cut the selvages off. Using your Easy Angle Ruler cut 6 pairs of triangles (the darkened tip of the ruler will extend beyond the edge of the fabric) from the strip pairs.

Sew the triangle pairs together on the hypotenuse (that is the long side) to form half-square triangles. Press the seams towards the dark (G9).

You should now have SIX half-square triangles, each measuring $2\frac{1}{2}$ ". Place them in the bag labeled "Block 12".

In your bags labeled "Block 9", "Block 10", "Block 11", "Block 12", "Block 13" you now have all the parts necessary to assemble your blocks.

Following the diagram on the following page, assemble ONE "Block 9" and place it back into the "Block 9" bag.

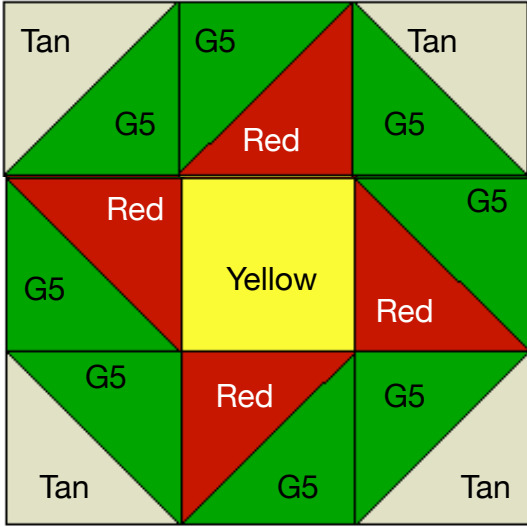
Following the diagram on the following page, assemble FOUR "Block 10" and place it back into the "Block 10" bag.

Following the diagram on the following page, assemble SIX "Block 11" and place it back into the "Block 11" bag.

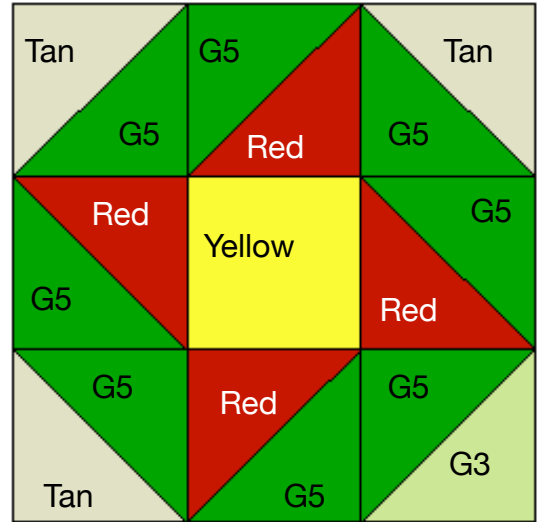
Following the diagram on the following page, assemble THREE "Block 12" and place it back into the "Block 12" bag.

Following the diagram on the following page, assemble FOUR "Block 13" and place it back into the "Block 13" bag.

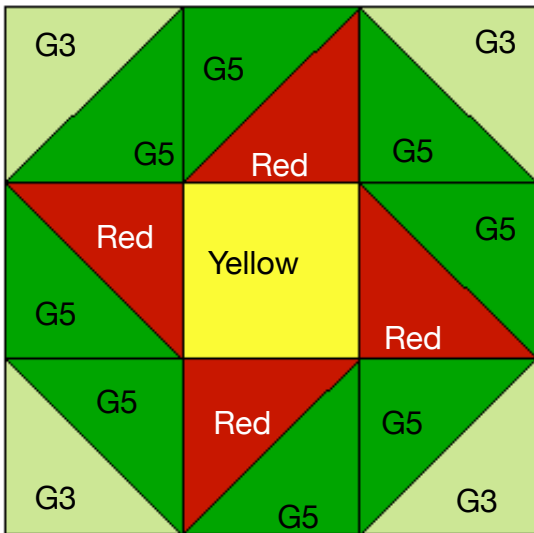

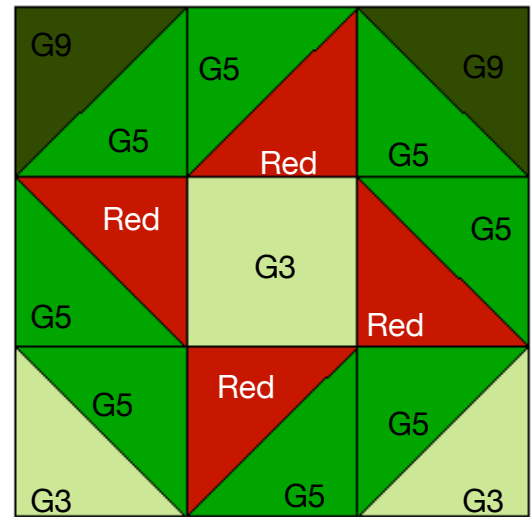
