General Meeting Minutes (November 20, 2022) by Amy Allison

- The meeting was brought to order at 2 pm by Guild President Nancy Moore.
- General meeting notes from October were approved as posted in the newsletter.
- Treasurer's report as of November 2022 Checking \$7,903.72 + CDs \$18,158.01 = \$26,061.73 Rhonda was able to be at the guild meeting today!
- Nancy announced the Christmas party for the December 18 guild meeting will have sandwiches and drinks from Publix, and a pastry chef (Colleen's daughter Hannah) will be making the desserts! There will be some gluten free options.
- 1 VP Naomi Bonilla reported that Sandy Russell will be giving a workshop in the Spring of 2023 on hand applique. The Pizza Girls will be giving their workshop on May 20, 2023 and a trunk show at the guild meeting on May 21, 2023. Naomi is hoping for 3-4 workshops next year. If you have something you would like to see as a workshop, please contact Naomi.
- 2 VP Colleen Heacock reported having 381 placemats plus those turned in today will probably bring the total to at least 400 for the Meals on Wheels program. Next month, please bring in a gift bag for an exchange gift – the limit is \$15 – can be fabric, notions, something made, etc. Please bring a Fat Quarter for the outgoing officers – Nancy and Colleen.
- Challenges There are 11 quilts to vote on! One quilt did have the bell on the panel cut into the shape of an eagle and appliqued on. The printed directions did not specify that the bell was to remain intact.
- Baby Quilts Marlene provided a baby quilt update. Cape Fear Hospital has closed the NICU and Pediatrics to visitors due to the high rate of RSV, flu, and COVID. Marlene will get with Pam Gahan and Donna Lazar to meet at the hospital to meet the social worker who will transport the quilts to the NICU. Thank you, Pam and Donna for volunteering as the Baby Chairs.
- VA Quilts Judy has 5 quilts plus the 12 challenge quilts turned in today making a total of 93 quilts for the VA hospital. Please keep turning in your quilts as they will be delivered in February.
- Membership Cindy reported there are 44 people attending today! Please bring your membership form next month to renew.
- Raffle Tickets Mandy has new twin grandchildren a boy and a girl! She's on call to help her daughter with the new grandbabies. Carol Starnes is taking care of the tickets and ticket money for next month. Nancy Moore will take care of the raffle quilt. - There is a break to allow members to view the challenge quilts and vote.
- Election of Officers Parliamentarian Karen Potts read the names of the members who have volunteered for an office from the nominating committee. After each office was announced, Karen asked if there was any other nomination for that office. Because there is only one person nominated for each office, the guild did not need to vote. The officers will be installed at the December guild meeting.
- Parliamentarian Karen Potts announced the Kay Bryan Scholarship Winner Debby Grice
- Door Prizes were given out. Debra let everyone know that she has plenty of door prizes for next month – be prepared to take something home!
- FQ Amy Allison won! Next month's FQ is whatever you would like to bring it will be a surprise!
- BOM There were 12 blocks turned in and Colleen won! Pat had a copy of next month's block and it will be in the newsletter.

Tarheel Quilters' Guild Block of the Month November 2022 – Balkan Puzzle

Fabric Requirements: Medium green (shown in gray on hardcopy), White on white, Red (shown in black) and a Christmas Print

Cutting Directions (Traditional Method):

1. Red Fabric – Cut 1 square 6 ¼" and cut twice on the diagonal

2. White Fabric (for Flying Geese): Cut 4 squares 3 3/8" and cut once on the diagonal

3. White Fabric (for HST): Cut 2 squares 3 3/8 and draw a diagonal line on the wrong side

4. Green Fabric – Cut 4 squares 3 3/8"

5. Christmas Print Fabric – Cut 2 squares 3 3/8"

Cutting Directions (Four at a Time Fast Flying Geese):

- A. Cut the same pieces of fabric listed in steps 1 and 2 above, but <u>do not</u> sub-cut
- B. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the white squares
- C. Cut the fabric for the HSTs as listed in steps 3-5

Sewing Directions:

(<u>Traditional Flying Geese</u>) Sew one small background triangle from step 2 to one diagonal edge of the red triangle from step 1; press toward the small triangle. Sew the second small triangle to the other diagonal edge of the large triangle to make a flying-geese unit; press toward the small triangle. Make 4 Flying Geese; geese units are 3" x 5".

(<u>Fast Flying Geese</u>) On the wrong side of each of the 4 small squares, draw a diagonal line; with right sides together, place two marked squares on opposite corners of the red square. Stitch a scant 1/4" seam on both sides of the drawn lines. Cut on the drawn lines. Press toward the small triangles.

With right sides together, place 1 of the small marked squares on the corner of each piece. Stitch a scant 1/4" seam allowance on both sides of the drawn line. Cut on the drawn line. Press the seam allowances toward the small triangles. Do this twice to make 4 Flying Geese.

(<u>Half Square Triangles</u>) draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of each of background squares. Place right sides together with a green square and sew ¼" on each side of the line and then cut along the line. Press to the <u>white</u> fabric . Make 4 HSTs. Repeat for the green and print squares, press 2 to the print fabric and 2 to the green fabric, making 4 more HSTs. HST units are 3" x 3"

Block Assembly – Sew a background and green HST to a green and print HST. Sew this unit to a flying geese unit to form a square; press open. Do this 4 times. Sew the four squares together as shown in the block diagram at the top of the page.

This is a 10" finished block (10 ½" unfinished)
