The guild without workshops and programs would just be a quilt club. Ann Jackson volunteered to be Secretary, and Debbie Pedersen volunteered to be 1VP for workshops. Karen Potts then used the by-laws to conduct the nominating and voting for the board. Those who volunteered where nominated from the floor, then all voted by aye or nay since only one person had volunteered for each position.

*To date, the guild does not have a venue for a quilt show next year, so we will continue to plan for a show in 2025.

*Treasurer Rhonda reported having \$3,359.27 + \$18,165.56 CDs for a total of \$21,524.83.

*The guild has made \$2,000 on the raffle quilt. A big "Thank You" to Joyce Boatman and Lisa Barefoot for selling so many tickets! Rhonda will pay the church for next year's rent of \$2,000 for our meeting space.

*1VP Naomi reported contacting a certified teacher for Shannon Brinkley's applique collage quilts and Linda Hahn as possible workshops for next year. Also, guild member Sana Moulder may give a machine applique workshop.

*2VP Debby is lining up a program for January on Barn Quilts to start the year off.

*Secretary Amy did not have any correspondence from the post office.

*Baby Quilts – Pam reported 4 girls and 8 boys for the NICU.

*VA Quilts – Judy reported having 107 quilts plus the 11 challenges turned in today.

*Marlene reported that she delivered 130 Christmas stockings to the NICU. She will give a workshop next year to replenish our stocking numbers for the NICU.

*Membership – Cindy reported our total membership is 89 members with 16 new members this year. There are 54 attendees today.

*Sunshine - Charlotte gave out birthday cards.

*There were 22 fat quarters won by Ann Jackson, but she said she won last time, so another number was chosen and Naomi Bonilla won the Christmas Fat Quarters!

*Door prizes, there were 8 bags prepared by Debra Eberline. One of the guests today won a door prize.




This makes a 12" block!...includes regular template piecing, or paper piecing!

Preparing the Pieces and Sewing the Block **

SIX " SQUARE



Start this one by drafting your templates. Draw a 6" square on paper. Then draw a line from the upper left corner to the half way point of the lower side. (The 3" point) Cut these two shapes out. Tape or stick them to new paper, and add 1/4" to each side. Cut out these new pieces and transfer to the template material of your choosing ...




Now cut out two triangles of Color 1 ...



Cut out two triangles of Color 2 ...




Cut out four background shapes from Color 3



Then sew the triangles of each color to the four background shapes, as shown at left. You will need two of each color combo. Trim to measure 6-1/2" each if needed...
