General Meeting Minutes (May 21, 2023)

- The meeting was brought to order at 2 pm by Guild President Barbara Munoz.
- Barbara opened the meeting by introducing Cindy and Patti the Pizza Girls!
   They gave a spectacular trunk show the work they accomplished during Covid was awesome! They talked about being raised on a farm some of their family still works the farm and raises grass fed beef.
   (runningbeef.com) The participants showed the samples they were able to complete from the workshop on Saturday. There were 16 participants on Saturday. Then the guild took a 20-25 minute break to shop there were patterns, templates, fabric, and kits.
- Barbara continued the meeting by asking if there were any corrections or additions needed for the minutes from the April meeting. There were none, and the minutes were approved.
- Treasurer's report Amy gave the report for Rhonda. Checking account \$6,579.68 + CDs \$18,161,.69 = \$24,741.37
- **Baby Quilts** Pam reported giving out 4 girls, 4 boys, 1 twin girls, and 1 twin boy/girl quilts.
- VA Quilts Judy reported having 45 quilts on hand plus what was turned in today.
- **1VP Naomi** reported the next workshop is on June 13, Tuesday from 10 am-4 pm at the church with Anita Andersen showing quilting on your domestic machine for \$20 each. There may be a workshop on September 16 with Annette Ornelas for \$40 each – Naomi will have a sign up sheet next month for interest. Naomi reported there is an AccuQuilt Go! Baby fabric cutter that was donated to the guild, and it will be raffled off this summer.
- **Membership** Cindy reported 56 members here with 4 guests.
- **Parliamentarian** Carolyn Edwards has resigned her position if anyone is interested in this position, please see Barbara at the end of the meeting. (Denise Singer volunteered to be Parliamentarian).
- Sunshine Birthday cards were distributed. Door Prizes there were 8 bags. Fat Quarters Sonia Blue won 27!
- BOM Anita Locklear won 20 blocks!
- Barbara wants a sew day on August 19, Saturday to put the sashing and blocks together for the 2024 Raffle quilt. Meeting place to TBA in July. Barbara reminded the guild that we need to keep selling raffle tickets for the 2023 Quilt to offset the guild's operating expenses. Please see Mandy Christianson or Lori Cruz for tickets.
- Raising Dues Discussion & Vote Irene Grimes made a motion to raise the membership dues to \$40 starting next year. Naomi Bonilla seconded the motion. Discussion there were many members who spoke about how inflation has increased costs and the guild is no exception. Expenses have gone up, such as the meeting space rent, the storage facility, the post office box, and batting these are all necessities for the guild. The board thoughtfully considered this before bringing it up to the guild membership. The guild does not have the membership numbers that it once had in the past. The guild mails out newsletters to those members who do not use email, postage adds up. The guild does have quite a lot of money in the bank, but when the guild spends more than it takes in, the CDs will only last 4 more years or through 2027. Some members did ask about the workshop costs when it was stated that this month's workshop needed 35 participants to break even. That is a discussion for another time as that is off topic of raising the membership dues. However, that is a good question and can be discussed at the next meeting. Raising the membership dues is not a long term solution for the guild's budget. Nancy Moore made a motion to vote on raising the membership dues. Debbie \_\_\_\_\_\_ seconded the motion. (Amy did not know Debbie's last name). Membership voted The votes were counted 49 members voted Yes, 6 voted No. The motion was passed to have membership dues at \$40 starting in 2024.
- **2VP Debby** asked those who completed their UFOs to show their projects and then get their ticket and put \$ in the jar. So far, there have been 75 UFO projects completed! The winner in December gets all the money in the jar. She reported that the July general meeting will be "Christmas in July" where guild members will show fun and quick projects for gift giving. Please plan on bringing finger food to enjoy at the meeting such as cookies, etc.



This makes a 12" block! I'm doing this one in traditional piecing, making it a GREAT one for beginners!




#### \*\* Preparing the Pieces and Sewing the Block \*\*









Next mark and cut the Color 2 4-1/2" x 18" strip into four 4-1/2" squares...




Now mark and cut the Color 3 4-7/8" x 9-3/4"strip into two 4-7/8" squares. Stack and cut these squares once on the diagonal to make four half square triangles...



Sew a Color 3 half square triangle to a Color 1 half square triangle, right sides together, using as SCANT 1/4" seam. Repeat this to make a total of four half square like this...



Now piece the block, using the diagram at left for placement and orientation of the units, using the Color 1 4-1/2" square as the block's center. Make rows first, then join the rows, alternating pressing directions as you do this. All Done!! :0)
