Quilts of Valor was founded in 2013 to award service members guilts in honor and thanks for their service. They award quilts to members of all branches of service and have awarded over 375,000 guilts in just over 10 years. The local chapter #14682 (All American Quilters) has the highest quilt recipient request list in the state and meets one Sunday a month at Loving Stitches to sew and socialize. Quilts are machine guilted and approximately 60x80". 





#### **CHALLENGES 2024**

Chair: Linda DeGraw

This year there will be three challenges (April, July and November).

Prize money will be \$50, \$40 and \$30.

Only one entry per quilter.

#### April - Baby Book Favorite

What is your favorite baby book to read to your little ones? We'll be using the Crayola 64 crayons (I'll provide the box). And everyone interested in participating in the Challenge will pick two (2) colors, and add a neutral color of cream, white or grey. The three (3) chosen colors must be in your quilt and the design will be from your chosen baby book. (Winnie the Pooh, Eeyore, Kanga). In addition to the finished quilt please bring a note card that states the name of the book and the crayons that you used. The quilt must meet the standard requirements for NICU quilts (36' x 36'). Quilter's name on label should be covered with painter's tape or filled in after the challenge prizes are awarded.

#### July - The State Fair!

This quilt is your vision of the State Fair. Your quilt may be as large as 55"x 55" or as small as 18" x 18". Everyone will be given a fat quarter you must use a piece of in your quilt. You may use collage, traditional blocks, paper piecing, applique or other techniques you wish to show us. Quilter's name on label should be covered with painter's tape or filled in after the challenge prizes are awarded.

#### November - Your America

Make a VA quilt. Your quilt must meet standard requirements for a VA quilt (45" x 45") Please do not make a flag. Show us your idea of America: ie. a playground, a snow topped mountain, a church or a beach. Quilter's name on label should be covered with painter's tape or filled in after the challenge prizes are awarded.

### Tarheel Quilters Guild - Block of the Month

Suggested colors of green, gold and blue (sub for pink in the center)

Easy Chicago Geese by Elaine Huff 2022

Fabric Requirements for a 12" Finished Chicago Geese:

White: 1 - 5" square Pink: 1 - 5" square

Dark Agua: 4 - 4.5" squares

Light Gold: 1 - 2.5" x 4.5" rectangle, and 1 - 2.5: x 6.5" rectangle Light Aqua: 1 - 2.5" x 6.5" rectangle, and 1 - 2.5" x 8.5" rectangle Light Yellow: 1 - 2.5" x 8.5" rectangle, and 1 - 2.5" x 10.5" rectangle Med. Aqua: 1 - 2.5" x 10.5" rectangle, and 1 2.5" x 12.5" rectangle




Step 1: Match the White 5" square and Pink 5" square right sides together. Mark a diagonal line from corner to corner on the back of the White square and sew 1/4" (or a little less) on each side of the line.

Step 2: Cut along the diagonal line. You will have 2 half-square triangle (HST) patches. You need one HST for each block.

Step 3: Open up the patch and press the seam allowance toward the Pink fabric. Trim/square up the unit to

4.5" square.



Step 4: Mark a diagonal line from corner to comer on the back of the four Dark Aqua 4.5" squares.

Step 5: Sew the Light Gold 2.5" x 4.5" rectangle and the Light Gold 2.5" x 6.5" rectangle to two sides of the HST. Press the seam allowances toward the rectangles.

Step 6: Lay out one of the Dark Aqua 4.5" squares as shown in Diagram 6 and sew a thread or two away from the marked line in what will be the seam allowance (this allows space for the fabric to fold in the next step).

Step 7: Match up the corners of Dark Aqua square and press.

Step 8: Trim away the excess seam allowance.

Step 9: Refold the Dark Aqua to complete this first Flying Geese comer.



10: Repeat Steps 5 through 9 substituting the Light Aqua rectangles for the Light Gold rectangles.

Step 11: Repeat Steps 5 through 9 again only using the Light-Yellow rectangles.

Step 12: Repeat Steps 5 through 9 again but substitute the Medium Aqua rectangles for the Light Gold ones.
