I want to thank everyone who participated in the "Make a Block into A Baby Quilt" challenge. 20 beautiful and creative quilts graced the stage at our April meeting. Congratulations to our winners – Nancy Eckert (Hedgehog), Sonia Blue (Carpenter's

Star) and Ashley Ledford (Strawberry).

Our next challenge, "Black, White and Bright", is scheduled for July. The rules as published in February: "Make something quilted – anything you want to make – baby quilt, VA quilt, wall hanging, placemats, quilted apparel, quilted bag, etc. Rules – must be quilted and include black fabric and



white fabric or a black and white fabric and one bright fabric." And as mentioned in last month's newsletter – one entry per person. Please see Pat Paulson for questions.

General Meeting Minutes (April 16, 2023)

- The meeting was brought to order at 2 pm by Guild President Barbara Munoz.
- Barbara brought to attention the written notice for a consideration of increasing the membership dues and vote at the general meeting in May. Anita Andersen brought up that before Covid in 2019, the guild voted on doing smaller activities to promote the guild and fundraise since there had been no quilt show since 2016. Lori Cruz offered to organize activities to help with generating funds for the guild. There were some questions: why are we considering raising the dues when it seems that we have a lot of money in the bank account? Treasurer Rhonda answered this with facts that church rent, storage fees, post office box rent, and batting have all gone up with inflation. She also stated that the guild has spent around \$4,000/year and only take in around \$2,000. The guild tries to break even with workshops. Parliamentarian Carolyn gave us some stats on membership fees: 80 members x \$25 = \$2,000 80 members x \$35 = \$2,800 80 members x \$40 = \$3,200 Please come to the May meeting to discuss further and vote on membership dues!
- General meeting minutes from March 2023 were approved as posted in the newsletter. Thanks Ashley!
- Treasurer's report as of April 1, 2023 Checking \$6,184.46 + CDs \$18,161.07 = \$24,345.53
- 1VP Naomi There were 17 at the workshop with Sandy Russell teaching needle turned applique! A good time was had by all. Next workshop is May 20 Pizza Girls doing the Dresden Diva! Please have your \$40 for the workshop if you are attending. There is a \$9 kit fee payable on the workshop day. Cindy and Patti will give a trunk show at the guild meeting on May 21. September 16 workshop with Annette Ornelas Southwind Designs. Pattern has not been decided it will be \$40 as she is a national teacher.
- 2VP Debby UFOs must be shown during show and tell, afterward please pick up a ticket and put your \$1 in the jar.
- Secretary Amy read a "thank you" card from Kathy Middleton for the flowers and cards sent to her after she got out of the hospital. Please keep Kathy in your thoughts as she fell after getting home, and she's back in the hospital.
- Baby Quilts Pam reported that the social worker will be sending info for required sizes, etc for the NICU. There's been some confusion on what size and materials for the baby quilts. Sandy Matthews (recently retired NICU nurse) will join Pam and Donna on the committee to review and write the baby quilt guidelines for the SOPs.
- Membership Cindy reports 60 people in attendance! 2 guests with 1 becoming a new member! We currently have 84 members.

- Program Challenge quilts! There were 20 bright, fun, whimsical baby quilts to vote on!

Member Notice:



Tarheel Quilters Guild - Block of the Month April 2023



This makes a 12" block!



This is an original pattern. Please abide by the <u>Terms</u> <u>and Conditions of use!</u> :0)

** Preparing the Pieces and Sewing the Block **




First, from a navy print, ...stars work well... cut one 9-7/8" half square triangle (from a 9-7/8" square cut in half once on the diagonal)...



Next, cut thirteen 3-7/8" half square triangles from a variety of tan/cream prints. It's okay to have some repeats within a block, but the more different prints used, the merrier the block! Cut ten 3-7/8" half square triangles from a variety of red prints...



Sew pairs of red and tan half square triangles to make a total of ten half squares. Use scant 1/4" seams, and press seams to the darker side. Trim these back to measure 3-1/2" if needed...



Next, piece the block! Sew four vertical rows of half squares, using the extra tan half square triangles at the top of the three shortest rows. Sew these vertical rows together using a scant 1/4" seam, and then sew on the blue corner triangle to complete the block!
