- -The meeting was brought to order at 2 pm by 2VP Debby Grice.
- -Tony from CityView magazine was here to take pictures of our Show n Tell quilts.
- -The meeting began with Show N Tell there were many beautiful Fall quilts as well as baby and VA quilts shown. Ann brought her witch in black silhouette on orange.
- -Nancy Eckert shared that she has 4 antique family quilts that no one in the family wants to keep.
- She is offering them to anyone in the guild that collects and maintains antique guilts.
- -Amy read the board meeting minutes from October 9 th . No corrections needed, approved as read.
- -Membership: MaryLou is filling in for Cindy there are 49 members in attendance, no visitors.
- -Door Prizes: 8 bags were given out.
- -Treasurer Rhonda confirmed the amount from the board minutes -
- \$2,403.27 checking + \$18,164.84 CDs = \$20,568.11 total
- -Rhonda shared the informational flyer made by Pam Gahan that we gave out at the Botanical Gardens. Thank you, Pam!
- -Please thank Lisa Barefoot, who is a guild member, for selling \$600 of raffle tickets! B&B Fence company bought \$100 of tickets.
- -Secretary: Amy had no reports.
- -Baby quilts: Pam shared that there does seem to be more boys born than girls. She gave out 9 boys, 8 girls, and one set of boy twins. One of the boy twins passed away and she gave the mother two quilts as she wanted to hang one on the wall in memory.
- -VA quilts: Judy reported having 98 quilts + the ones turned in today.
- -Newsletter: Ashley mentioned that some members are not getting the newsletter in their email, some are sent to the spam folder. She will investigate and try to get the newsletter to all.
- -Sara Y is selling her Sweet 16 Handiquilter and will have an ad in the newsletter.
- -Scholarship: Carol Starnes is our scholarship chair. Please have your point sheets ready at the November meeting. If you have any questions, please contact her. The point sheet is on our website.
- -Sew Days: Nancy stated that we do not have any sew days planning this month. We have had some nice sew days to work on guild projects this year.
- -Sunshine: Charlotte passed out birthday cards.
- -Fat Quarters: Ann Jackson won 29 fat guarters!
- -BOM: Anita Locklear won 20 blocks!
- -2VP Debby discussed that the guild will need to vote/volunteer for the board and committee chairs in November. Parliamentarian Denise Singer will have ballots if there are more than one person running for a position. Karen Potts, a previous parliamentarian, did mention that in the past the guild did vote, but in recent years, usually only one person per position volunteers.
- -Debby talked about the December meeting party being catered or members bringing a covered dish. Did the guild want to vote today or wait until November to decide? The membership voted 40 members for a covered dish and 9 voted for catering. Ashley will have a sign up sheet next month for those who would like to bring paper goods instead of food. We also need some volunteers to set up and clean up the food table.
- -Program on Guild Volunteer Needs, Leadership Roles & Board Vacancies. \*see page 7
- -Sanford Guild Show October 20/21 Volunteers needed. You will need to buy an admission ticket to the show even if you work our raffle quilt table. Please get a postcard to save \$1 off admission.
- -UFOs were shared Marlene had 9 projects! Don't forget to bring your completed UFOs next month and add to the pot of money that will be won!
- -Joy Canady shared that there is a BBQ fundraiser at the Gray's Creek Community Center on 3024 School Rd in Hope Mills (it's beside the elementary school) this Thursday, October 19 from 11 am -2 pm.
- -Meeting is adjourned at 3:52 pm.

# October 2023 Program - TQG Volunteer Opportunities & Leadership (Board) Roles

- -Debby talked about the job duties of the president. The president attends the board and general meetings and delegates the board and committee chairs.
- -Naomi discussed being the 1VP providing workshops for the guild, usually one every three months or 3-4 workshops for the year. She talked about national teachers as well as our guild members who teach. She is reaching out to Shannon Brinkley and Aby Dolinger to possibly have two workshops set up for next year. That will help the new workshop chair for next year. Naomi was a new member when she stepped up to take this job and she has enjoyed it!
- -Debby also discussed the duties of 2VP as being creative and providing programs at the meetings. When there is a workshop on a Saturday, usually the teacher will be the program for the meeting. Debby is willing to help and mentor the new 2VP chair next year.
- -Secretary Amy shared that she keeps a notebook and takes notes for the board and general meeting. She is willing to have a notebook set up for the new secretary for next year.
- -Treasurer Rhonda discussed that the bank is only on-line, no statements are mailed. She goes to the ATM at the bank with the bank card and makes her deposit of any checks and cash. The guild does have to submit an online E card for the IRS to maintain our non-profit status. If you are used to doing online banking, this is not difficult and Rhonda would be glad to mentor the new treasurer.
- -Baby Quilts Donna cuts the batting and brings it to the meetings with labels. Pam contacts the social worker at the NICU and arranges a day/time to drop off the number of quilts asked for. If you are interested, please volunteer! This works well with two people.
- -VA Quilts Judy keeps a book where members sign when they turn in a VA quilt. She contacts the VA representative in January to bring the quilts in February. Judy has done this for three years and loves this job. Please volunteer!
- -Challenges Pat talked about having 3 challenges per year Baby quilt, VA quilts, and one any category there are many ideas online for quilt challenges. Pat will not be doing this next year, please consider taking this position, it is fun to see what the quild creates!
- -Ashley shared that the newsletter is on Word and Google Docs with templates. Please let her know if you are interested in taking on the newsletter next year.
- -Colleen takes placemats in November for the Meals on Wheels program. If you would like to help with that next year, please let her know.
- -Marlene has 100 stockings left from last year, so she is good for this December for the NICU. Next year, we will need a sew day to make stockings.
- -2VP Debby talked about the raffle quilt chair position. That job entails giving out raffle tickets, taking in monies and ticket stubs, finding events to take the quilt to sell tickets, and getting guild members to help with sitting at the raffle table as this is our big money maker for the guild. Mandy discussed that the raffle quilt chair should have a committee working with them as well. It does take a lot of time finding opportunities and being able to take the quilt out to sell tickets. If you are interested in being the raffle quilt chair or on the raffle quilt committee to work with the chair, please let us know at the meeting next month. Debby also stated that we need to be thinking of a quilt design for the 2025 raffle quilt.

# Bachelor's Puzzle

It's a 12" block!

Ok...who, besides me, thinks it is MORE than a little Ironic that the Bachelor's Puzzle, is in the shape of a RING?? LOLOL!




Please abide by the <u>Terms and Conditions</u> of use! :o)

#### \*\* Preparing the Pieces and Sewing the Block \*\*



Start by marking and cutting the Color 3 3-1/2" x 14" strip into four 3-1/2" squares...



Next speed piece the half squares by stacking a Color 4 and a Color 1 3-7/8" x 7-3/4" strip, right sides together and all edges aligned. On the back of the top strip lightly mark the 3-7/8" square line, and mark the diagonals as shown at left. Now sew a SCANT 1/4" above and below the marked diagonals, pivoting at the square line. Cut apart on the square line and on the diagonals between the rows of stitching. Press the seam allowances towards the darker fabric. This will give you four Color 4/ Color 1 half squares. Repeat this same procedure with the Color 4/Color 2 strips, and the Color 1 / Color 2 strips to get four each of those color combos. Trim to measure 3-1/2" if needed...



Now make rows as shown at left. Sew the rows together to make the block, alternating pressing directions as you go to avoid bulky seams. Seems the Bachelor's Puzzle was an easy one to solve! :o)

Traditional Block
