Final Challenge of 2023 - One Month Warning!

Our final 2023 challenge, Stars and/or Stripes, is the VA quilt challenge. Entries are due at our November meeting. Rules are as follows: Make a VA guilt – it must feature either stars or stripes or stars and stripes. It cannot resemble a flag and must meet standard requirements for a VA quilt (VA quilts should be forty-five (45) inches in each direction. The VA lap guilts need to be long enough to cover the patient's legs in a wheelchair but not so long as to interfere with moving in the wheelchair. They must be hand or machine quilted (not tied) at intervals of no greater than 4".) The guilter's name on label should be covered with painter's tape or filled in after the challenge prizes are awarded. Questions? See Pat Poulson

- The meeting was brought to order at 2 pm by Guild President Barbara Munoz.

 - Barbara also talked about the executive board offices that need to be filled for next year. There are many opportunities **1VP, 2VP, Treasurer, and Secretary**. Contact the board members if you are interested and would like more info on the job details. Nominations should be made next month, elections held in November! We must have board members to keep the guild going!
- Treasurer Rhonda reported that the guild has \$2,938.04 + \$18,164.30 = \$21,102.34 Rhonda discussed the upcoming sew day on September 23 from 9 am to 5 pm at the East Regional Library on 4809 Clinton Rd. - 2VP Debby talked about the raffle quilt chair position for next year. That job entails giving out raffle tickets, taking in monies and ticket stubs, finding events to take the quilt to sell tickets, and getting guild members to help with sitting at the raffle table. The year has gone by quickly and we have missed some opportunities to show the guilt and sell tickets.

Tarheel Quilters Guild - Block of the Month October 2023




This makes a 12" block, and is perhaps the Ultimate Beginners Block!

3 Blocks x 4 Blocks with a 2" border makes a perfect Project Linus Quilt Sized Quilt!


** Preparing the Pieces and Sewing the Block **



Sew the Color 1, 2 and 3 2-1/2" x 26" strips right sides together along the long edges as shown at top left, using a scant 1/4" seam allowance. Press seams to darker sides. Mark and cut this at 6-1/2" intervals...



Now rotate the units and sew them together as shown at left. Make two horizontal rows, pressing row seams in opposing directions. Sew the rows together, and it's all done!



Here's one sample layout, using nine blocks as we made them above. You'll find there are MANY different layouts possible though, by alternating the order in which your strips are sewn together, adding extra colors etc. This is a great one to plan out on graph paper!
