Workshops - Nancy Hope, 1st VP

Hello Everyone,

I completed Workshop #2 Make a "Ribbon Pole" Quilt with Rob Appell of Man Sewing! I will tell you truthfully, it was a little confusing at first because even with the worksheet you can download, I couldn't find any written measurements for the size of the blocks. However, during his tutorial, Rob Appell told us they were 10" blocks- so that's what I made. (I realize now that you can make the blocks any size you want as long as they are all the same size.) I chose to make my blocks using Christmas fabrics that were left-over from our 'Mystery Quilt' workshop with Ronda Thomas.

Rob Appell of Man Sewing has a good video that I watched where he explained both the cutting and the sewing. Then, following the worksheet, it was fairly easy to lay out and sew the blocks together.

My table runner was completed, the border was on, and I began using the 'temporary adhesive spray for fabrics' to baste it all together. As you can see, I made a small error!



Using my trusty seam ripper, I took apart the necessary blocks to fix the problem.



The finished table runner will look great at Christmas time!

To show the versatility of this pattern, here is the lap quilt top Anita Andersen made using 5-inch blocks with contrasting floral prints for the ribbons.

Who is YOUR Favorite Quilting Personality?

Ivelca Nintzel - My favorite is Edyta Sitar (Laundry Basket Quilts) but Sue Daley is great too. Depends on what technique I want to tackle!

Gladys Pedrojew - My favorite quilter is Natalia Bonner. To me, she is such a great quilter and has the most beautiful designs for quilting. She shares her knowledge so generously and makes learning from her so easy. I've been quilting for a while now and never really had the confidence to use rulers when quilting, but I have learned so much from her I've actually been doing a lot more with them.

In June, she completed a whole year of "Let's Stitch a Block a day" for 365 days. And presently she is teaching a "9 Patch quilt along. Both of these are on YouTube and are free. She has a website, Piecenquilt.com where you can purchase her books, classes, thread, and lots of other things to go along with her classes. She also has a blog. Happy quilting,

Lightning [As I, Anita Andersen, was getting ready to send out this month's newsletter I happened across this announcement in my AQS email and felt compelled to share in case anyone in the TOO. share in case anyone in the TQG wishes to participate. As a life long North Carolinian, I have lived through MANY hurricanes including Hugo (1989) that raced

through Charlotte and Isabel (2003) that destroyed the Outer Banks and whose eye literally came right over my house. But I believe those experiences don't compare to the ravages of these fires. I have volunteered to coordinate the shipping of any guilts that guild members may want to donate to this cause. I have made contact with Helen Klee of PVQA. She said quilts slightly larger than 48"x60" are preferred and please include a label.]

This quilt drive is a combined effort of the Pajaro Valley Quilt Association (PVQA) and the Santa Cruz County Emergency Operations Center (EOC). Each survivor will choose a guilt, providing them comfort and helping fill an emotional void in their lives.

Although they are asking for personal sized quilts (with a minimum size of 48" x 60"), they will accept quilts for baby, toddler, students and 18 or older adults. They are also working with We Care, who will provide quilts to students enrolled in the public school. The quilts for the school kids, listed above, will be used for those kids not enrolled in public schools (home schooled, private, and charter or inter/intra transfer students).



Section 2: The elected officers shall be a President, First Vice-President, Second Vice-President, Treasurer and Secretary. The President may appoint a Parlimentarian. These officers constitute the Executive Committee. It shall be the duty of these officers to implement the objectives, policies, and ethical practices of this Guild.

- a. <u>Duties of the President</u>: the president shall be the principal officer of this Guild and shall:
 - Preside at all meetings of the Guild, the Board of Directors, the Executive Committee, and the General Membership; appoint Standing and Special Committees as required to accomplish the mission of the Guild;
 - 2. Serve as an ex-officio member of all committees except for the Nominating Committee and the Audit Committee; and
 - 3. Ensure all programs, projects, and all activities for the Guild be developed for the ensuing year in accordance with the objectives and policies of the Guild.
- b. Duties of the First Vice-President: the First Vice-President shall:
 - 1. Perform the duties of the President in the President's absence:
 - 2. Become President for the unexpired term in case of death, resignation, or incapacity of the President;
 - 3. Serve as Workshop Chairperson and be responsible for obtaining qualified teachers for workshops and special programs as approved by the Board of Directors; and
 - 4. Perform duties as assigned by the President.
- c. Duties of the Second Vice-President: the Second Vice-President shall:
 - 1. Serve as Program Chairperson and be responsible for developing and coordinating programs for the General Membership meeting; and
 - 2. Perform other duties as assigned by the President.
- d. <u>Duties of the Secretary</u>: the Secretary shall:
 - Record accurate minutes of all meetings of this Guild, the Board of Directors, and the Executive Committee;
 - 2. Furnish the President with a paper or digital copy of the minutes;
 - During each General Membership Meeting, move for correction and/or approval of the
 previous meeting's minutes. If copies of the minutes of the previous meeting were not
 provided to the membership in advance, read minutes for corrections and approval and
 read correspondence pertaining to matters of the Guild that have been received by the
 President;
 - 4. Prepare official correspondence for the Board of Directors as needed; and preserve in a permanent file all minutes and correspondence of value to the Guild and its Officers.
- e. Duties of the Treasurer: the Treasurer shall:
 - 1. Be responsible for all monies of the Guild and provide a financial report at General Membership Meetings;
 - 2. Upon receipt of expenditures, reimburse members; and, disburse funds in accordance with the budget or as directed by the Board of Directors;
 - 3. Keep an itemized record, in a permanent file, of all receipts and expenditures and give a written report of same as required;
 - 4. Serve as Chairman of the Finance Committee;
 - 5. Conduct tax filings in accordance with the Internal Revenue Code;
 - 6. Deliver to the appointed Auditor or Audit Committee all financial records by January 15, or as soon as possible; and
 - 7. Deliver to the incoming Treasurer all books, records and papers pertaining to financial matters immediately after the audit and request a receipt thereof.



BIRDS IN THE AIR

From assorted darks cut:


1 - 7" square 4 - 4" squares

From assorted lights cut: 1 - 7" square 4 - 4" squares

Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of all light squares. Place these right sides together with the dark squares. Sew seam 1/4 inch from both sides of drawn line. Cut apart on drawn line and press open. Trim large squares down to 6-1/2" and small squares to 3-1/2".

Sew four small half square triangles together into a 6-1/2' square. Sew remaining four small HST's together into a second 6-1/2" square.

Arrange these squares with the large half square triangles as shown in diagram and sew together to finish the block.
