## Challenge Update

The next challenge, Stars and/or Stripes, is the VA quilt challenge. Entries are due at our November meeting.

Rules are as follows: Make a VA quilt – it must feature either stars or stripes or stars and stripes. It cannot resemble a flag and must meet standard requirements for a VA quilt (VA quilts should be forty-five (45) inches in each direction. The VA lap quilts need to be long enough to cover the patient's legs in a wheelchair but not so long as to interfere with moving in the wheelchair. They must be hand or machine quilted (not tied) at intervals of no greater than 4".) The quilter's name on label should be covered with painter's tape or filled in after the challenge prizes are awarded. Questions? See Pat Poulson

## General Meeting Minutes (August 20, 2023)

- The meeting was brought to order at 2 pm by Guild President Barbara Munoz.
- Treasurer Rhonda reported that the guild has \$3,203.50 + \$18,163.03 = \$21,366.53
- 1VP Naomi shared upcoming workshop with **Annette Ornelas on September 16, 2023**. Cost is \$40 for members, \$50 for non-members, plus \$9 for the pumpkin pattern. It's not too late to sign up!
- We had a great free workshop on July 29 @ Spring Lake library. There were 13 sewers that made a 6 fat quarter bag with 2 teachers – Nancy and Marguerite. Participants showed their finished bags.
- 2VP Debby was unable to have the workshop on August 19 – it will be rescheduled.
- UFOs – Karen T had one UFO ticket today.
- Secretary Amy had no correspondence from the post office box.
- Baby Quilts – Pam reported giving 20 quilts to the NICU in July; there were 8 girls and 11 boys! We need some more boy quilts please.
- VA quilts – Judy reported that she had 73 quilts + 18 quilts turned in today makes 91 quilts!
- Membership had 41 in attendance today.
- Sunshine – Charlotte gave out birthday cards.
- BOM – There were 7 blocks – Pam G won!
- Fat Quarters – 15 fat quarters went to Pam G! She was very lucky today!
- Door Prizes – Debra gave out 8 bags.
- President Barbara reminded guild members that Sabrina T is still taking donations for the migrant worker's group in Dunn. They need fabric, notions, thread, etc. Barbara also stated that the guild gets a nominating committee together in Sept/Oct as we vote for new board members in Nov. The new guild year starts in Dec with the installation of the board. One can serve on a board office for two consecutive years. If you are interested, please contact the board members.
- Rhonda talked about the guild being in the October CityView magazine as they feature Arts Council member groups. We are invited to have a booth at the Food, Wine, and Art event on Thursday, October 12 at the Botanical Gardens from 6-9 pm. There is an entry fee of \$35/\$45 to attend.
- The guild had items donated and winners were selected randomly through a number generator. Carmen C won the Go Baby!, Jane D won the serger, and Ann J won the steamer.
- Program – Amy Allison talked about what it takes to host a Quilt Show. There was a handout with information to take home. Besides talking about committees, guild members Irene G, Sana M, and Pat P participated in answering questions and letting guild members know about their experiences with hosting a quilt show. Hosting a show is a lot of work, and it can be a lot of fun! Pat spoke about inspiring others as the main reason for having a show. At least 75% of the members present showed interest and volunteered for some committees! Stay tuned as we get a venue and date set. Thank you to all who asked questions and to those who had the answers! Thank you to Nancy and Ann F for sharing their lovely ribbons as examples for making ribbons.
- Show and Tell – lovely quilts that could be entered in the Hearts and Hands show in October!
- Meeting was adjourned at 3:40 pm.

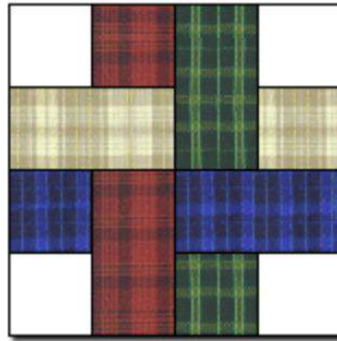


# Tarheel Quilters Guild - Block of the Month September 2023

## Woven Ribbons

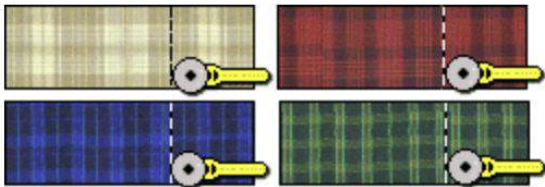
This makes a 12" block, and is Easy Easy Easy! You could do it smaller or larger with ease also!

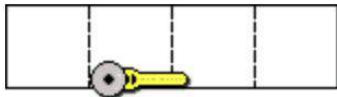

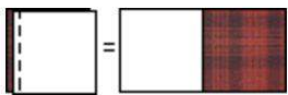
### \*\* Preparing the Pieces and Sewing the Block \*\*



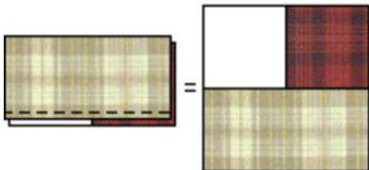
Mark and cut each of the "ribbon" colored strips into one 3-1/2" square, and one 3-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangle of each...



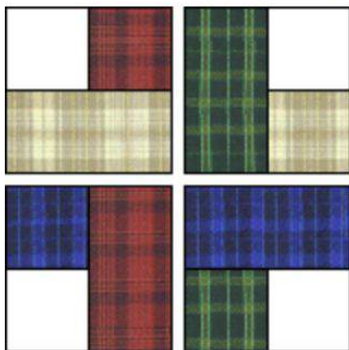
Mark and cut the background colored strip into four 3- 1/2" squares...



Sew each of the back ground colored squares right sides together to a ribbon colored square, using a SCANT 1/4" seam. Press seam allowances towards the darker fabrics. You will have four of these units...



Now sew a ribbon rectangle to the appropriate 2-square unit, again right sides together and using a SCANT 1/4" seam. Press seam allowances towards the rectangles...



Then sew the four quadrants together as shown at left! Alternate pressing directions with each addition to keep your seams nice and flat! See? Wasn't that an easy one??!!
