"Zoom is a cloud-based video conferencing service you can use to virtually meet with others - either by video or audio-only or both, all while conducting live chats - and it lets you record those sessions to view later."

Tarheel Quilters Guild has purchased a Zoom Pro account for \$14.99 per month so that we can conduct virtual board meetings, general meetings and programs while we are unable to meet in person."

There are lots and lots of YouTube tutorials on how to use Zoom with "tips and tricks." We encourage you to view one or more based on the type of device you are using so that you can enjoy the Zoom meetings as much as possible.

Here are a few Suggestions that will make a meeting run more smoothly.

- Join the meeting a few minutes early. The host will add you to the meeting.
- Know how to select your view options on your device Gallery view or Active Speaker
- Know how to mute and unmute yourself (The Host may have control over this at times.)
- Participants stay muted unless called upon to speak. When participants are not muted any noise can
 activate their screen as the active speaker opening a pop can, telephone ringing, others talking in the
 room, dogs barking and other background noises- This often overrides the "recognized" active speaker
 in the meeting.
- Participants raise a hand when they wish to contribute.
- Know how to use the chat function for typing comments instead of using audio.

While not a perfect situation Zoom allows us to see each other and helps us feel less isolated.



Christmas Star - 10" Quilt Block Pattern

Fabric Kev: Cutting Instructions:

Cut five 2-1/2" squares.

Cut eight 2-7/8" squares.

Cut eight 2-7/8" squares and four 2-1/2" squares.


If you prefer, you can use my free printable 2" Half-Square Triangle paper to make this block even faster! If you use this method, skip Step 2 and don't cut out the 2-7/8" squares. Just follow the directions on the paper. You'll need to print two sheets to make this block.

Sewing Instructions:

Step 1: Using a pencil and ruler, draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of all red and cream 2-7/8" squares.

Step 2: With right sides together, layer a cream 2-7/8" square on a red 2-7/8" square. Stitch a 1/4" seam on each side of the diagonal line that you drew in Step 1. Cut apart on the drawn line and press seam allowance toward the darker fabric. Trim points. Repeat seven times more for a total of sixteen cream/red half-square triangles.

Step 3: Arrange cream/red half-square triangles, green 2-1/2" squares, and cream 2-1/2" squares as shown in *Diagram 1*. With right sides together and using a scant 1/4" seam, sew together to form rows as shown in *Diagram 2*. Sew rows as shown in *Diagram 3* to finish the block.
